Com.su.bin base – la Spezia, Italy, Italian Marine Force

COMSUBIN (Comando Raggruppamento Subacquei e Incursori) is the elite Italian combat frogman force and one of the first Italian special forces: their record can be traced back to World War I. Forged by an extremely hard training, the "subacquei" (divers) and "incursori" (raiders) forming the COMSUBIN are a formidable corp of offence and defence.

For this prestigious task force, Myrtha Pools successfully installed in 2000 a 33m training diving pool in the corps headquarter, based at Le Grazie, in the gulf of La Spezia









Leghorn Naval Academy, Italy

The Italian Naval Academy (Italian: Accademia Navale) is a coeducational military university in Leghorn (Livorno), Tuscany, which is responsible for the technical training of military officers of the Italian Navy.

It is a prestigious military university; its surface covers 215.000 sqm and hosts yearly almost 1250 students as cadets and officers. In 2004 Myrtha Pools completely renovated with its special patented technology Renovaction the 50 m pool inside the sport complex.









Allied Joint Force Command base – Naples, Italy, Italian NATO Forces

Allied Joint Force Command (JFC) Naples prepares for, plans and conducts military operations in order to preserve the peace, security and territorial integrity of Alliance member states. Twenty-two NATO nations contribute to the JFC Naples military staff in order to deter aggression and to contribute to the effective defense of NATO territory and forces, safeguard freedom of the seas and economic lifelines and to preserve or restore the security of NATO nations.



In the main base, located in Naples, Myrtha Pools was proud to renovate the filtration plant of the existing officers pool.

Camp Ederle – Vicenza, Italy, USA Army Installation Management Command

Camp Ederle is an Italian post where the U.S. Army has troops stationed located in Vicenza, Italy. The post serves as the headquarters of United States Army Africa, the 173d Airborne Brigade and the U.S Army Installation Management Command, an umbrella for all U.S. military properties in Vicenza.

The USAG Vicenza Fitness Center inside the Camp provides a high level of mission sustaining sports, fitness and aquatics programs and activities that promote healthy lifestyles.

For this reason, in the recreational center inside the camp, across from the Arena Entertainment Center, Myrtha was charged to install in the past a 25x10 m Overflow Classic Myrtha pool.

In 2012 a contract was signed for the Renovaction of another pool. Works are still under progress.

Canadian Force Base - Cold Lake, Canada, Royal Canadian Air Force

Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake, commonly referred to as CFB Cold Lake, is a base located within the city of Cold Lake, Alberta. It is operated as an air force base by the Royal Canadian Air Force and it provides general purpose, multi-role, combat capable forces in support of domestic and international roles of Canada's Air Force. In 1998 Myrtha Pools was awarded by Canadian Army for the supply and installation of a Myrtha competition pool, dimension 25x15mx1.2-3.5 m





Canadian Forces Base – Comox, Canada, Royal Canadian Air Force

Located 5 Km north northeast of Comox, British Columbia, CFB Comox is the primary air defence installation on Canada's Pacific coast and serves as the home base for maritime patrol/antisubmarine aircraft and fixed-wing and rotary-wing search and rescue aircraft. It is moreover the location of the Canadian Forces School of Search and Rescue, where all para-rescue specialists in the Canadian Forces undergo training.

Also, in this base, Myrtha Pools installed a 25x15m competition pool.







Canadian Forces Base – Gagetown, Canada, Royal Canadian Air Force

CFB Gagetown is a large Canadian Forces Base located in southwestern New Brunswick. It boasts an 1100 square kilometres training area, 1500 kms of roads, 900 kms of tracks, 740 buildings and some 6000 military and civilian personnel at the main base and lodger units across New Brunswick and PEI.

In the CFB recreation center, Myrtha Pools renovated in 2000 a competition Overflow classic pool, dimensions 25x12,5x1,2m with Renovaction technology.

Canadian Forces Base – Petawawa, Canada, Canadian Forces Land Force Command

Canadian Forces Base Petawawa, commonly referred to as CFB Petawawa, is a Canadian Forces Base located in Petawawa, Ontario. It is operated as an army base by Canadian Forces Land Force Command. The base has an extensive infrastructure with 465 buildings and over 300 km² of property comprising the Petawawa Training Area. The main fitness facility houses a 5.000 m² field house containing, among the other facilities (indoor running track, whirlpool and sauna) also a 25x12,5 m pool, which Myrtha

Hill air force base, Utah USA

Hill Air Force Base is a major U.S. military base located in northern Utah, 30 miles north of Salt Lake City. In 2004 Myrtha Pools renovated the outdoor pool situated in the recreational center with a RenovAction Skimmer Mosaic 25x12.7m H1.05-3.6m

Hærens Jegerkommando is a special forces unit of the Norwegian military. It is the armed forces competence centre for commando, airborne and counter terrorist duty in the Norwegian Army. Its headquarters are located 30 kilometres north of Elverum in the southeast of Norway, at

In the base, at the time under construction, Myrtha Pools built in 1996 a Myrtha Overflow Classic, dimensions m 25x11 indoor pool






BIR base, Camerun, Brigade Intervention Rapid special forces

This brand-new pool, installed in 2011, consists of 2 Myrtha Pools, a 5x10x0.35 Renovaction Classic and a 25x22.5x1.20-3.8 Myrtha Classic, built for the Brigade Intervention Rapide, a military special force of Cameroun Army.

The 25 m pool has a special area, 3,8 m deep, specially built for divers training.









Benghazy, para-troopers forces, Libya

The very first Myrtha built for an International Army! In 1976, more than 35 years ago, Myrtha Pools successfully completed a huge pool (dimension 65x18!) for the para-troopers forces of Benghazy, Libya.

Myanmar National Swimming Complex

Least but not last, the most recent Myrtha project for Army forces, still under construction: a complete swimming complex for the military government of Myanmar to be built in the new capital city Nayphitaw.

It will include:

- a competition swimming pool, dimensions 51,5 m x25 h.3 m Cer/1 technology
- a diving pool, dimensions 25x25 h. 5 m Renovaction technology
- a warm-up pool, dimensions 50x25 h.135-180, RenovAction technology







UNIFA (University of the Air Force, Rio de Janeiro)

The new Myrtha swimming-pool built inside Rio's Universidade da Força Aérea was commissioned by the Brazilian Ministry of the Air Force one year before the opening of the Olympic Games.

The Ministry were quick to choose to have the highest quality for their sporting facility that would be a training pool for the Olympic Games yet would remain as a permanent fixture in the Ministry's university campus.

Installed in under two months, the swimming-pool and the sporting centre are now an outstanding legacy for Rio: there is no other facility within miles that can boast such a prestigious centre of excellence and training for future athletes.

This pool is equipped with the innovative Virtual Trainer system, with LED strips embedded into the lane lines to assist the swimmers' pace as they train.
